**Or** students may complete their additional selective course requirements using the <u>one</u> of the options in the ADDITIONAL OPTIONS box below.

#### ADDITIONAL OPTIONS

Students may use <u>one</u> of the following three options to complete the requirement for 12 additional credit hours of selective coursework (9 additional credit hours in the Airport Management focus area).

1. Complete an academic minor in Management or End-User Computing Systems

OR

2. Complete 4 consecutively sequenced foreign language courses in 1 language (ex. FR 10100, 10200, 20100, 20200). Students who test out of Levels I, II, and/or III of a language may substitute free electives for each course they test out of; such students must satisfactorily complete the Level IV.

OR

3. Complete AT 14400, 14500, 21000, 21100, 24300, 24500, 24800, 24900, 25300 and 25400. An FAA commercial/instrument pilot certificate may be presented to establish credit in these courses. Students will be awarded credit using AT 46200, Occupational Cert. and Licensure. Such credit will most likely NOT transfer to another institution.

### 3. CTI AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL

All Air Traffic Control focus area students must complete: AT 36900 Air Traffic Control

#### **CTI Air Traffic Control Endorsement**

All AT students may take the required CTI ATC courses if desired. To be eligible to add the CTI endorsement to your degree program you must complete your degree with the following specific courses included in the degree program. Students must obtain a grade of 'C' or better in the required courses to be eligible for CTI endorsement.
