

Aviation Safety Management Graduate Certificate Plan of Study Overview

The Aviation Safety Management Graduate Certificate is 100% online. The flexible certificate requires 12 credit-hours and can take 1-3 years to complete, depending on your schedule. All of your course activities, assignments, and exams must be completed by their respective due dates. You will need to view course lectures regularly to keep current. The typical length of our courses are offered in 16-Week Modules each spring and fall.

As a Purdue graduate student you will be taking classes in an online environment. Instructors provide the material, lectures, tests and assignments that can be accessed at any time on Purdue's Platform, <u>BlackBoard</u>. Your lectures are not time restricted, meaning you don't need to be logged in to preview your course material at a specific time.
